### COMMUNICATION

In these instances, I would suggest contacting the Class Teacher on Class Dojo to arrange a telephone conversation – this can also be done by phoning or emailing the school office. Teaching Assistants are on Class Dojo so they can see and comment on posts, but please do not message them about classroom concerns – these remain the responsibility of Class Teachers.














# Summer Reading Challenge



The Summer Reading Challenge is an annual challenge run jointly by The Reading Agency and public libraries. This year the theme is Wild World Heroes, with a nature-themed challenge, supported by the World Wildlife Fund.

# The Challenge

- Children must be members of the library service. Join the library here <a href="https://bit.ly/2VR7Q1N">https://bit.ly/2VR7Q1N</a> and be ready!
- The challenge invites children to read any six library books or more during the summer holidays.
- Families can sign up for the challenge at any library, at any stage in the summer from Friday 23 July.
- Children can borrow books via our Select & Collect service <a href="https://bit.ly/3kT809v">https://bit.ly/3kT809v</a> or using our e-books, magazines and audiobooks available from our Virtual Library https://bit.ly/3vj9l9D
- Some libraries are open for in-person browsing now and we hope all libraries will be by the start of the challenge. Updates here: https://bit.ly/3fKHit6
- Children collect rewards for the books they read a bookmark for reading 2 books; a pencil for reading 4 books; a certificate and a medal for reading 6 books.
- Children aged 4-16 completing the challenge (6 books) will be entered into a lucky dip at their library for the chance to win a tablet computer.

There will also be fun online events. This summer we are excited to welcome back storyteller John Kirk on an online story hunt on 28th July, as we celebrate the British summer on an outing in the countryside. Jammed packed with interactive scavenger hunting fun this session is suitable for families with story hunters age 3+.

#### What is the new Health HUB?

- The new Bedfordshire and Luton Children's Health HUB has been created to make contacting our services by telephone and email easier and more convenient.
- There will be one shared telephone number and email address to access services.

#### Which services are included?

The HUB will bring together all calls and emails for the following Teams:

- 0-19 Team across Bedfordshire and Luton
- Bedfordshire and Luton Looked After Children's (LAC) Services
- Luton Community Paediatrics Service (Edwin Lobo)

#### When does the Health HUB launch?

- The Health HUB will go live on Tuesday 1st June 2021

- The opening hours are 9-5 Monday to Friday. The Health HUB is closed at weekends and Bank Holidays

#### Reasons for contacting the new Health HUB

The Health HUB will be the first point of contact for each of the services it covers. Calls will include:

- Enquiries about appointments and support from School Nurses and Health Visitors
- Calls from professional partners such as GP Surgeries and Social Care Teams
- Help with accessing clinics

- The Clinical Programme Lead for the team is Lorraine
- Team members are based in both Luton (The Poynt) and Bedford (Woburn Court)
- The Team will consist of Health HUB Administrators, Co-ordinators and an Operational Support Manager based across Bedfordshire and Luton

- The Health HUB will grow over time to include all CCS Children's Services across Bedfordshire and Luton
- We will contact you at each stage as Services move over to join the Health HUB contact point.
